Fire Safety

- R.A.C.E. –
 1. Rescue person in immediate danger

L.I.V.E

If the fire is not in your immediate area:

1. Listen for location of alarm
2. Inform coworkers of alarm and location
3. Verify all doors are closed and hallways cleared
4. Evacuate and prepare for further action as directed by Fire Marshall, take patient chart if necessary

P.A.S.S.

To Extinguish a fire:

1. Pull the pin from under the handle
 2. Aim the nozzle at the base or source of the fire
 3. Squeeze the handle
 4. Sweep from side to side
- (Stand approx. 10 feet away- get no closer than 6 feet, be sure and use an adequate amount and be sure to use the proper type of extinguisher.)

Electrical Safety

- Do not use equipment if cord is frayed or plug and cord are not connected well
- Do not use electrical equipment with wet hands or while standing in water
- Don't yank cords out of the outlet, always remove by using the plug
- Make sure the plug has the third grounding prong on it and has not been removed

Electrical Shock

- Do not touch the person
- Turn off the power or pull the plug
- If necessary, use non-conductive item (wood broom or belt) to free person from current
- Call for help and administer first aid
- Shock may cause: Paralysis, respiratory failure, heart failure and severe burns
